OPEN CALL

We are excited to announce the Open Call for the *International Architecture Biennial of Antalya* 4.5 (IABA), centered around the theme **In-Between**.

IABA is the first and only International Architecture Biennial in Turkey, initiated and organized by the Chamber of Architects of Türkiye, Antalya Branch. The first edition was held in 2011 under the theme of *Intersections*, followed by *Template* in 2013, *Thinking the Future* in 2015, and *Continuity* in 2017. According to Biennial's regular schedule, the 5th edition was originally planned for 2019. However, due to the COVID 19 Pandemic, the event was postponed, and the series was temporarily suspended.

With its 2025 edition, IABA aims to regain its momentum and reestablish continuity. The title **4.5** reflects this transitional moment—marking both a return to the biennial rhythm and a bridge between past and present practices. It symbolizes the shift brought on by the pandemic, which altered daily life on both global and local scales, introducing new habits, redefined routines, and lasting transformations. In this sense, 4.5 refers to a condition of **being in between/in-betweenness**—a space between what was and what is emerging.

IABA has been recognized for its commitment to pushing architectural boundaries and offering a platform for diverse perspectives on contemporary architectural, urban, and social issues. In keeping with this mission, IABA 4.5 seeks to encourage intercultural and interdisciplinary dialogue, support artistic expression, stimulate debate, and enrich the overall biennial experience.

To achieve this, the Biennial will include an Open Call Compilation, in addition to its Main Exhibition featuring invited architects. The Open Call aims to create a shared platform for participants wishing to contribute their ideas and works, fostering diversity and representation, and broadening the conversation within the Biennial framework.

The 5th edition of the IABA is scheduled to take place from November 3-9, 2025.

TERMS OF PARTICIPATION

1) IABA 4.5 / IN-BETWEEN and the OPEN CALL

The IABA 4.5 theme **In-Between** draws inspiration from our exposure to the tensions and complexities of being on the verge of developments and transitions - from the familiar to the unforeseen, and from the expected to the unpredictable. In this context, the Biennial aims to foster awareness, reflection and dialogue that express the multidimensionality and pressures of this condition, through the framework question: **Towards Where Architecture and the City Expand in the New World Order**?

Guided by this central question, the Biennial seeks to engage with current global issues topics such as artificial intelligence; boundless digitalization; hegemonic technologies; the social media phenomenon; migration and displacement; conflict and war; human health; sustainability and resistance; environmental and climate urgency; food access and food safety; healthy living environments and shelter; social and spatial justice; urban and human security; cultural erosion; urban identity; social and the permeability of social and spatial boundaries – all within the scope of architecture.

The curatorial approach of IABA 4.5 emphasizes participation and encourages interdisciplinary contributions, representation and public engagement.

To this end, the OPEN CALL invites proposals that respond to the Biennial theme and question with designs and ideas that prioritize public interaction and communicative impact.

2) APPLICATION FILE

Applications are open to individuals and researchers from all disciplines, whether institutionally affiliated or independent.

Applications must be prepared as a single PDF file not exceeding 20 MB (no additional files or other formats should be submitted — video or audio files may be included). The application file should be sent using file transfer services (e.g., WeTransfer, Google Drive, etc.). The link to the uploaded file must be sent from the applicant's own email address. The email should clearly state the applicant's full name and contact information. For group submissions, the email must include the full name and contact information of all team members. The official languages of the International Architecture Biennial of Antalya (IABA) 4.5 are Turkish and English.

- > Who is the target audience? How will your work interact with them?
- > What influenced your choice of language, materials, techniques and representational form?

Technical and Physical Information

- Work format (e.g. installation, two-dimensional work, video)
- > Materials used
- Production techniques (if any special methods are used)
- > Installation requirements (electricity, sound system, etc.)
- > Setup and placement instructions (if necessary)

Visuals

Include visual representations such as sketches, drawings, models, renders or collages. Each image should have a short title and description.

3. EXHIBITION SPACE FORMAT

Maximum exhibition space dimensions are given below:

- > Two-dimensional works: to fit on a maximum surface of 150 x 200 cm,
- > Installations and three-dimensional works: to fit on an area of maximum 240 x 240 cm, there is no height limit.
- > Videos (in HD MPEG format): to have a maximum projection size of 200 x 100 cm.

Works exceeding these dimensions will not be considered.

Participants are responsible for the safe packaging, transport, installation and dismantling of their works. Assistance from architecture students may be available upon request.

4) SUBMISSION

Applications must be submitted in PDF format, as described above.

5) EXHIBITION

The exhibition venue and format for selected works will be determined by the committee following the evaluation. Works may be exhibited collectively, in groups or individually – either within the Biennial venue or in appropriate city locations.

For large-scale three-dimensional works, applicants may propose specific exhibition sites within the city or the Biennial area. However, these proposals are subject to availability and feasibility, and alternative locations may be suggested.
